LADIES BIBLE STUDY



Pastor's Ponderings

PASTOR CARL — Grace. This is a word that keeps coming to my mind. For some reason I have pondered this word more during the corona virus shutdown than ever before. The world talks a lot about karma - getting what you deserve; what goes around comes around. But grace is getting what you don't deserve. In the church, we understand this a little bit when we talk about God's grace. John 1:16 – From the fullness of His grace, we have all received one blessing after another. Think about that verse for a minute. Reflect on all of the blessings that you have received (that you don't deserve) because of God's grace! Grace is a fundamental characteristic of God. It is who God is. God doesn't discriminate with His grace. His grace is not just for Christians or for Jewish people or for Americans.

As Christians, we are to be developing God-like characteristics. Yet I fear that it is a characteristic that can easily become one sided. Grace is something we all want to receive, but we may be slow to give it away. We expect people to show us grace, but aren't so willing to extend it to others. I believe that we as an American society lack grace for one another, which has lead to this whole mindset of "if you disagree with me, you are wrong and I therefore I dislike you". I also believe that we as

Christians have hurt our witness and influence because we are weak in grace. Lack of grace has split churches, destroyed marriages and ruined friendships.

Grace isn't a license to act however I want and treat people any way I please. In Romans 6:1 Paul makes that point. He says, should we go on sinning so that grace may increase? By no means! Just because God's grace covers my sin, doesn't give me the freedom to sin. Even in the midst of grace there are consequences and healthy boundaries have to be drawn.

Colossians 4:5-6 says: Be wise in the way that you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone. Reread those two verses. Paul says that as believers, our conversation should always be full of grace. How we talk to people and how we talk about people needs to be full of grace. In today's world, that conversation includes not just our spoken words, but our tweets, texts and social media posts. Are your texts, tweets, social media posts always full of grace? I confess that my words are not always full of

grace. And that hurts my witness and influence when they are not. What is more important – to prove I am right OR to be full of grace? I don't believe that those two things have to be exclusive of one another. We can be gracious in sharing our feelings, opinion with others. We can strive to be like Jesus who John characterized as being full of grace & truth (John 1:14). As our country becomes more and more divided, as people's attitudes become more "I'm right, you are wrong" may the conversation of the followers of Christ become more and more full of grace.

As you disagree with people, have varying viewpoints, differ in opinions, and see things from different perspectives, may you overflow with grace. The more you keep in mind how much grace God has extended you, the more you can extend grace to others. The good news is that you can grow in grace. 2 Peter 3:18 – But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

As we live in this caustic world, let us be people of grace. May we heed Paul's words to Timothy, where he told Timothy to be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus (2 Timothy 2:1)



MISSIONARY Spotlight

JIM & KAREN PICKETT – MISSIONARIES IN MOZAMBIQUE WITH GLOBAL PARTNERS

Jim and Karen's vision is to equip the church in Mozambique to plant, develop, and administer healthy churches. They do that, in cooperation with local pastors, by teaching at the Xai-Xai Bible College and at seminars across Mozambique, producing study manuals for small groups in the Portuguese language and distributing Bibles and audio Scripture radios.




The Bible College has closed due to the Covid-19 virus and Jim and Karen, like so many others, are now working from home. They have been teaching their bible classes via photocopies and WhatsApp messages. It is a steep learning curve for some students. A few families made contributions to buy their student an Android phone and so it's their first time using the internet. Others only have simple phones. For these, Jim and Karen call them every few days and listen to their answers over the phone. Online classes and church services are not possible here. Mozambique has limited internet and most people can only afford small daily bundles for 10 cents to go on Facebook/Twitter/Whatsapp. Karen & Jim are finding other ways to connect with their community remotely. Karen, for example, started a devotional in Portuguese on Facebook to encourage people locally when they are able to go on social media.

Specific Prayer Requests from Karen Pickett:

- Pray for wisdom regarding our return to the U.S. for home ministries. We were scheduled to leave on May 18, 2020, but the flight was cancelled last month. Currently all flights are still cancelled. One of the biggest concerns for us personally is that our son just graduated high school this month and had a gap year lined up at a Christian camp in New Hampshire in September and was also going to practice driving to get his driver's license this summer.
- Pray for me (Karen) as I work on translating into Portuguese 3 levels of a middle school Sunday School curriculum. I have printed the first. I have just received back the edited copy of the second manual which I need to type in and organize printing.
- The cases of Covid19 are just beginning to increase in Mozambique at about 5-15 a day. Please pray for Jim as he has asthma and previously had a heart attack. For now, we are both working from home.







During the past two months of shut downs, quarantines and Covid-19 challenges we have seen many members of our congregation reach out and be the hands and feet of Jesus serving others in our community. Members of our congregation have also been recipients of the generosity of the Central NY community during this difficult time. I am so thankful to be a part of CWC and I LOVE

"I am a teacher in an impoverished district. Although it is right in our vicinity, I don't think people realize how deep the needs run and the utter difference just a few miles can make. When our new way of life hit with the Corona Virus, our districts first concern was the health and welfare of the students. Yes, we are schools and yes, we need to teach, however, you can't learn when you are hungry, you can't learn when you don't know where you are sleeping that night, you can't learn when you are worried about your physical wellbeing, whether it be physical or sexual abuse. Yes, these are the harsh realities that many students are dealing with and these are the concerns that weigh on the hearts of our district employees, administrators, teachers and staff from the bus drivers to the 1 on 1 aides and the hall monitors.

So, while I was home, trying to connect with my students, preparing lessons different than have ever prepared before, trying to navigate this new mode of teaching and learning I got thinking. Thinking for me can be a bit dangerous at times, but something was nagging at me. Finally, I felt like God wanted me to start moving.

I am the teacher that is known for her bake goods. My students will pretty much eat anything, but my brownies and cookies are their favorite. I felt very strongly that God wanted me to get out there and be his hands and feet.



Now, during Corona'cation, some parents might not want homemade goods, so I had a backup plan. I hit Costco, Target and Wegman's for lunch bags and a variety of snacks. I then hit up some of my friends in our women's Bible Study to see who might be willing to bake cookies, and they came through (thank you Beth DeWeese, Katie Morgan and Lynn Hannon). I set the back of my car up like a mini store so kids could pick several items to go along with a bag of cookies and a brownie. Next I got my co-pilot, Dee Wagner, and for 3 days over a two week period we made 85 deliveries from Oswego to Syracuse. It was amazing. At the end of the first day I said to my co-pilot, "I kinda feel guilty. I feel so good. I didn't do this for me it was for them."

Since then I have gotten a handful of thank you's.....although we got a ton in person. It is obvious that it really meant something to many of the students and their families. One comment that really hit me said, "You are the only person to have reached out during this whole time." Although we have been reaching out via phone, email and text.....the hands and feet are what these kids need!"

"I first started attending Community Wesleyan Church (CWC) in Baldwinsville in December of 2019 during Advent season. I feel that I was divinely led there and I felt welcomed immediately by the friendliness and warmth of the parishioners. What a blessing that was for me! I had been searching for a church for nearly three years and have attended many other churches but have never felt that I "fit" in and was truly a part of the people of the church. I started out right away attending adult Sunday school so that I could get to know others more quickly.

Then came the time of COVID-19 and the closing of the church physically but certainly not spiritually. We began to adapt and developed "virtual" church on Sundays, prayer meetings on Thursday evenings, and lady's bible study on Monday evenings. It was such a change in how we worshipped and transitioned to provide social distancing and stop the spread of the virus.

The most important part of all this change I want to share with you. I am a nurse practitioner and am working in an office that requires me to continue to see patient's in person every day and also see patient's via telemedicine visits. I felt very anxious and scarred that I would somehow become exposed to the virus but yet I had taken an oath to be there for each and every patient so I knew, regardless of that anxiety and fear, I had to continue with doing my job. But it was the outreach from the church that got me through some of my toughest moments and there has been many over these past few months during COVID-19 quarantine and isolation.

My first experience was at one of the first prayer meetings where everyone who attended that meeting prayed for all those workers who were working on the "front lines" and all the people who asked how I was doing and surviving during this scary time. My first prayer meeting I attended I was still in my office working but took a well-deserved break to be with others from church and join in the prayer service.

The next blessings and surprise were to have Deb and Dave Lewis contact me to set up a time to bring food over to me as they felt I may not have much time to cook and eat so that I could keep up my strength for the stress of my work and the long hours it required. I later found out that some other people from church had baked cookies for that gift of food and I was very touched that others had

taken the time to do that, and by the way, make some of the best chocolate chip cookies ever!! Thank you, Jill Alessi!

I also received text messages and calls from Marilyn Palermo whom I met in Sunday school classes and we became friends instantly. It seemed to be some sort of natural connection between us. She has been such a blessing to me by keeping in contact via phone calls, text messages, instant messenger, or email and we have continued to be in communication frequently over the past few weeks.

I also received cards from Mark and Diane Chermak whom I also met in Sunday school and I must mention that Diane has helped me immensely with learning who is who in the church and she even provided me with a picture church directory that she printed out on her computer! She also mailed me a list of people's names to put together with the pictures that were displayed on the virtual Easter Sunday service so that I could get to know people's identity despite the fact that we were not meeting in person for Sunday services.

What an angel!!

Another angel that I met at the beginning of attending CWC was Clara Graves. She is so warm and friendly and her inner spiritual light shown through on her face and smile the minute we met! She too has written me and has been sending me reading materials that she usually hands out at church every week along with a quick note to just check in on me.

Another angel that has also become a new friend since we have been doing virtual worshipping is Sandy Hilliard. We had only briefly met prior to COVID-19 and we re-met online during one of the lady's bible studies. We have continued to email, text, and send cards to each other to maintain a connection and to be sure each other is doing okay.

As some of you know I also had a death of a very good friend, former husband, and father of my two girls during this COVID-19 outbreak. I cannot say enough about what an angel and blessing Pastor Carl was to me. He took my phone call and I poured out my story to him and we prayed. Pastor Carl then
